1) Conference Location

The 2011 Forum on Capital as Power will be held from October 20-21, 2011. The conference will be located in the Senate Chamber on the 9th floor of Ross Building (room N940), on the Keele Campus of York University in Toronto, Ontario.

Ross Building is labelled building 28 on the map. If driving onto campus please also note the location of the visitor parking lots and garages. Be advised that guests are required to pay a daily parking fee and that recent construction around the university might interfere with traffic.

A) On campus

York University is situated outside of the downtown core. Commuting from downtown can generally take an hour. There are, however, limited options when it comes to accommodations near the university. There is a hotel on campus attached to the Schulich School of Business, however, they have a limited number of rooms and the cost per night can be quite high. York also offers short term apartment-style accommodations with private and self-contained washrooms, bedrooms, and kitchens. The per-night prices for these units are as follows: \$99.50 (all prices throughout the document in Canadian dollars) for a bachelor apartment; \$105.45 for a one-bedroom apartment; and \$111.00 for a two-bedroom apartment. Those interested in renting one of these units should e-mail suites@yorku.ca to inquire about availability.

B) Near Campus

There are a few more options near campus, although none are within a short walking distance of the university, and the surrounding neighbourhoods have few amenities (restaurants, etc.).

The Annex

The neighbourhood which we would recommend in particular is the Annex, as it is not only one of Toronto's most loved neighbourhoods, featuring many attractive amenities (restaurants, cafes, bookstores, bars, great breakfasts, etc.), but also, out of all of the downtown neighbourhoods, it is one of the most accessible from York.

Commute time from Spadina subway station is generally 45 minutes (for a transit map see below). Also, if anyone wishes to go out in the evening after the conference, there is a good chance it will be in this neighbourhood. 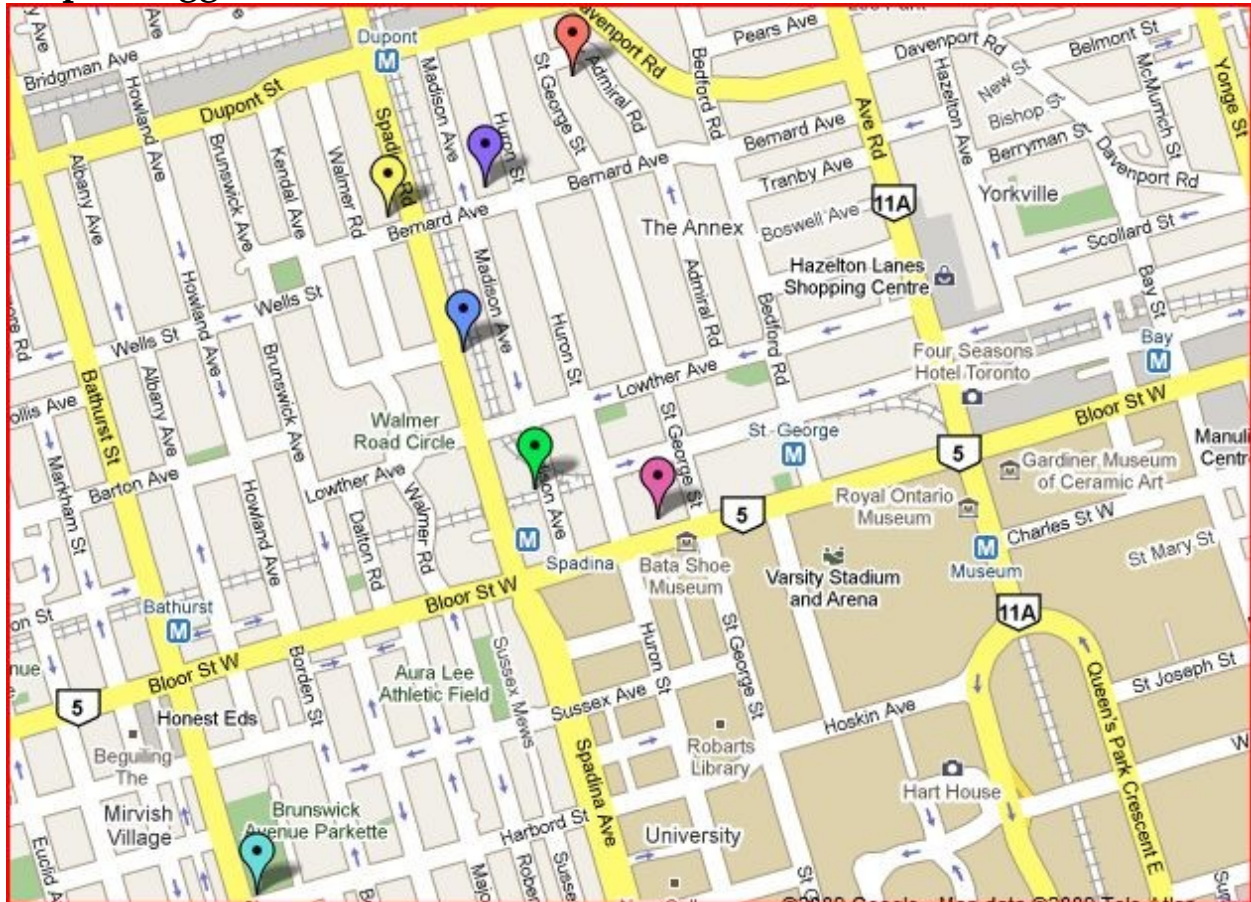

Getting from the airport (public transit):

If taking public transit from the airport, take bus no. 192 (The airport Rocket). This bus stops at every terminal and there will be directions on how to get to the bus stop at the airport.

This bus will take you to KIPLING station (the furthest point to the left on the map below). The subway from here then goes downtown. Depending on traffic the commute is around one hour to get downtown.

If proceeding from downtown straight to York, transfer to the North-bound subway line at either the SPADINA or ST. GEORGE station (see below for further details).

Travellers can also take bus no. 58a, which will take them to the LAWRENCE WEST subway station. From here they can take the subway either North (towards York) or South (towards downtown).

Total travel time from the airport to York University is about 90 minutes by public transit.

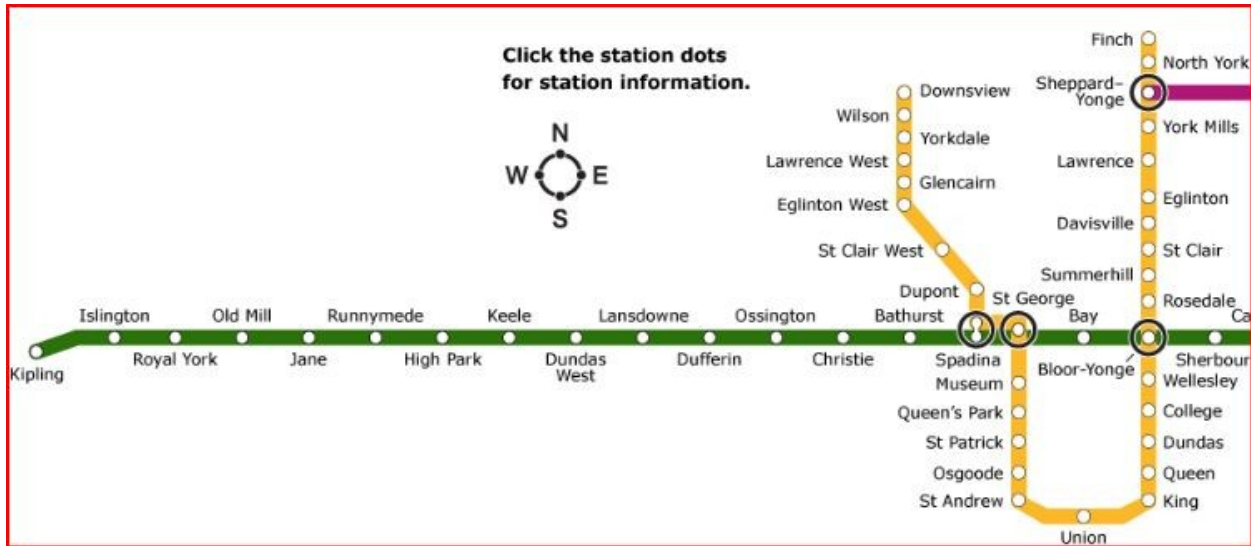
REMEMBER: when taking public transit in Toronto always make sure to have a transfer slip. These can be acquired from the vehicle driver (if taking the bus or streetcar) or an automated machine (if taking the subway).

Getting to York University (public transit):

York is situated on the Northern edge of the city and the subway does not go directly to campus. From downtown, take the subway to DOWNSVIEW station, the tip of the left-hand branch of the yellow line on the map below (also available here: <http://www3.ttc.ca/Subway/interactivemap.jsp>).

From DOWNSVIEW take bus 196A (The York express) to campus. Exit the bus at the last stop on the route, the York University Commons. Note that the bus will drop you off directly in front of the building in which the conference is located (York Lanes).

The total commute time from downtown is usually around an hour, depending on traffic.



Taxi Service

Taxi service from the airport to either downtown Toronto or York University will be readily available at all terminals of the airport. Rides will cost approximately \$35-\$40.
